

October 24, 2008 (COW – Prescription fraud)



The Chesterfield County / Colonial Heights Crime Solvers program needs your help to solve a prescription fraud case.

A man approached a pharmacist at CVS at 9201 Midlothian Turnpike shortly before 6



p.m. on Aug. 6. The suspect presented the pharmacist with a prescription for Vicodin for Jeff Wolf with a Midlothian address. The pharmacist became suspicious, contacted the doctor listed on the prescription and discovered the prescription had been forged. The suspect fled before police arrived.

The suspect is a white male, 30-37 years old and has dark hair. He wore a diamond-pattern polo shirt. The suspect's left arm was in a sling at the time of the incident.

October 17, 2008 (COW – Autumn Leaf Drive Purse Theft)

Crime Solvers needs your help to catch the suspect who stole a purse and used a victim's credit card at the Shell gas station at 6437 Iron Bridge Road.

The victim's purse was stolen from her unlocked vehicle in the 5200 block of Autumnleaf Drive on Tuesday, Aug. 26. The victim contacted credit card officials to report the stolen card and discovered the fraudulent gas charge.



The suspect is a black male with short, dark hair. He wore jeans and a black T-shirt. The suspect drove a silver Chevrolet Caprice with a dark front end.

October 10, 2008 (COW – Moorefield Office Park Wallet Theft)

This week the Chesterfield County/Colonial Heights Crime Solvers program needs your help to solve a case of bank-card fraud.

On Sept. 5, between 11:30 a.m. and 1 p.m., a law-firm employee at 901 Moorefield Park Drive had a wallet taken from her desk. The next day, the victim contacted her bank and discovered that her accounts had been emptied. Her bank confirmed seven unauthorized transactions in which more than \$800 was stolen.

The suspect was a black or Hispanic male, thin build, wearing a dark-colored shirt and a white ball cap. One of the transaction locations, the BP station at 4224 Beulah Road, had surveillance cameras on-site.



October 3, 2008 (COW – Abduction Robbery/WaWa)

Crime Solvers needs your help to catch a man who abducted a victim from a gas station and forced the victim to withdraw money from ATMs on Tuesday, July 8.



The suspect approached the victim while he was pumping gas at Wawa, 6001 Iron Bridge Road. The suspect displayed a gun and demanded the victim drive to the city of Richmond. The victim was forced to withdraw money from two Richmond ATMs. Once the suspect obtained the money, he jumped from the victim's car on Noble Road in Henrico County and fled on foot.

The suspect is a black male, 5 feet 10 inches tall, 25-35 years old with a goatee. He wore dark clothing to include a hat, bandana and backpack.
